GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE DISTRICT

LOCATION – LaSalle-Peru Township High School District 120 is in northern central Illinois at the crossroads of Interstates 80 and 39, approximately 90 miles southwest of Chicago, 80 miles east of the Rock Island-Moline metropolitan area, 67 miles north of the Bloomington-Normal communities, and 73 miles south of Rockford. The school district encompasses 184 square miles and serves the residents of LaSalle, Peru, Oglesby, Utica, Tonica, Cedar Point, Leonore, and Lostant. The state's major metropolitan areas are all within an hour of LaSalle. The LaSalle-Peru region has a rich legacy that includes the I & M Canal Trail, Starved Rock State Park, Matthiessen State Park, and access to the Illinois, Vermilion, and Fox rivers.

CURRICULUM — LaSalle-Peru Township High School offers a comprehensive and dynamic curriculum designed to meet the needs of all learners in grades 9 – 12. Students can access a wide range of Advanced Placement (AP) courses, full Project Lead The Way (PLTW) engineering and computer science programs, and extensive academic and vocational offerings. The curriculum includes world languages, fine arts, and career and technical education courses to support diverse interests and career paths. LaSalle-Peru is also home to the regional Area Career Center, providing specialized programs in fire science, health occupations, aviation, residential wiring, culinary arts, early childhood, welding, building trades, and auto mechanics. Through a strong dual credit partnership with Illinois Valley Community College, students can earn college credit while still in high school. The school operates on a 7-period day, provides Chromebooks to all students, and is committed to continuous improvement through the Professional Learning Communities (PLC) framework, ensuring a collaborative and student-focused approach to education.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS — The district creates a culture of students belonging through a connected campus. The Renaissance Program is a nationally recognized program focused on celebrating student and staff success. Link Crew is a freshman mentor program led by juniors and seniors, providing 9th graders with a smooth transition to high school. The Cavs Day program fosters empathy, understanding, and mutual support among students.

SPECIAL SERVICES — The district is a member of the LaSalle/Putnam Educational Alliance for Special Education Cooperative (L.E.A.S.E.), located in Ottawa, IL. The core of the district's student support services is six full-time counselors, two social workers, one psychologist, and the attendance advocacy program coordinator. OT, PT, and speech therapy services are sub-contracted.

FACILITIES — The campus comprises five buildings: the Main Building, East Gym/ACC Building, Transition House, Pope Auto Shop, and Dolan Building. Howard Fellows Stadium, built in 1938, is the district's historic football stadium and was recently renovated. Since 2012, the district, with the community's support, has invested over \$80M in facility improvements and new construction. Situated on 35 acres north of the main campus is the L-P Sports Complex, which houses an 8-lane track, 12 tennis courts, a turfed soccer field, and a softball/baseball complex. Future

TRANSPORTATION — The district is a member of a consortium of area school districts that contracts busing services with Johannes Bus Services.

FOOD SERVICE — The district employs all food service staff. The Director of Food Services and Nutrition oversees a team of 10 employees.

MEDICAL — Various medical, dental, optometrist, and pharmacy services are within a 15-mile radius, with OSF Health Care Saint Elizabeth Medical Center in Peru, OSF Saint Elizabeth Medical Center in Ottawa, and OSF Saint Paul Medical Center in Mendota. Communities within the district have highly regarded fire and ambulance services.

RECREATION — The Illinois Valley is home to the state's crown jewel – Starved Rock State Park. Outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy hiking, fishing, camping, cycling, and eagle bird watching. Our waterways offer marinas for boating and swimming opportunities. Golfers have access to several premier courses. Area communities host family-friendly festivals, carnivals, concerts, and 10K races each summer. The village of Utica closes down Mill Street every summer to set up outdoor eating and weekly concerts.

PLACES OF WORSHIP — Most religious affiliations and denominations serve the area.

CULTURAL — The Illinois Valley is widely known for supporting a vibrant fine arts and performing arts community. A sampling includes the Westclox Fine Arts Factory, The Paint Box, Music Suite 408, LaSalle Public Library, Peru Public Library, Uptown Playlist Theatre, Summer Music in the Park at the Carus Mansion, Stage 212 Community Theatre, IL Valley Pistol Shrimp minor league baseball, Illinois Valley Symphony Orchestra, LaSalle County Historical Society Museum, and the Westclox Museum.

RETAIL — The Illinois Valley is well known for its restaurants, which range from classic tavern-style chicken to upscale dining. Boutique shoppers will find plenty to choose from in LaSalle, Utica, Ottawa, and Princeton. Large box stores, such as Kohl's, Walmart, Home Depot, Staples, and Menards, can be found in Peru.
