**SPECIAL SERVICES** —Rooks Creek hires its own special education teacher and paraprofessionals. It is a part of the Livingston County Special Education Co-op.

**FACILITIES** — Graymont Elementary School is a single building for K-8 grade students with 50 students. The roof was replaced 9 years ago. HVAC, solar panels and a new special education room was completed in 2025. The building has upgraded to a T1 line. The PTO has installed new playground equipment for the students in the summer of 2025. We expect 4-5 new windmills in the district in the next year.

**TRANSPORTATION** — Rooks Creek provides its own bus drivers for two buses. The district has an agreement with First Student if we need additional or a substitute driver.

**FOOD SERVICE** — The district has its own cook and kitchen. It is a part of the Illinois Free and Reduced Breakfast and Lunch Programs. It is reimbursed at 60%+.

MEMBER OF —The district is part of ROE17, Livingston County Special Services unit, and co-ops athletics with Pontiac St. Mary's and Pontiac Junior High School as part of the Illinois Elementary School Association.

**MEDICAL SERVICES**— Local medical services are provided by OSF St. James in Pontiac and the Flanagan-Graymont Fire Department.

**RECREATION** — Opportunities include Humiston Woods, The Oaks at River's Edge Golf Course, Wolf's Creek Golf Course, Pontiac Recreation Facility, and local theatre groups.
